Chairman's Annual Report

As the Council has been unable to hold its Annual Parish Meeting since 2019 my comments span the last three years.

The parish coffers are in a very healthy state due to income from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) arising from the two housing developments in Green Road and Fishponds Way. I should like to remind everyone at this point that the CIL income was greatly enhanced, from 15% to 25% because we had a Neighbourhood Plan. This Plan was instrumental in denying the unsustainable planning application for a housing development at Haughley Park.
